PRESIDENT'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Col then proceeded with his report for the Rotary year 2004/2005.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

Captain Col took to the bridge from which, with the assistance of Lieutenant Don Ripper, who operated the projector, he recounted the details of the voyage that the good ship, RC Sale, had undertaken in the past 12 months.

The good captain gave everyone on board credit for the parts they played in achieving the results all the crew worked for. He made special mention of eight officers who helped to keep the ship on even keel when the seas were rough.

Col reminded us of the setbacks as well as the achievements and the loss to the ship's company of eight members including George Wilson and Stan Elliman.

Amongst the highs Col experienced during the year was the very well-organised and successful Centenary Dinner held at the Princeton and attended by members from the five Rotary Clubs in the Wellington Shire, the Annual Dinner Auction which boosted the funds for disbursement by a record \$21,000, the restoration of the courtyard at Ashleigh and the recruitment of 8 new able-bodied sea-farers to the crew.

Following his summary of the year's journey, Col was able to present cheques to representatives from various organisations in the community including Centenary House, Youth In Search, Skateboard Park, Anglicare, the Salvation Army, Bridge Foundation and the Sale Girl Guides and Brownies to add to the disbursements that had already been made earlier in the year. This included a donation of \$10,000 to Interplast.

Induction of Alan Lewis as President of RC of Sale for 2005/2006

For his final duty as President, Col inducted Alan Lewis as the President of the RC of Sale for 2005/2006, handed over his chain of office and charged all Sale Rotarians to give Alan their unqualified support and loyalty.

Alan informed the gathering that he first joined Sale Rotary in 1968. He resigned in 1973 when he became president of the Sale Hospital Committee. He also told those present that the name Lewis features prominently in the Sale Club with three previous members of note having the same name (Gordon, Milton and John). Alan thanked the Club for the confidence they have shown in him. He plans to build on the good work of Col and develop good communication with the other Wellington Rotary Clubs. He promises that his ship won't sink and that he knows how to steer. Before concluding, Alan presented Col with his Past President's badge and pin. Mike then closed the meeting.
