Chairman Graeme in introducing Scott noted that his late father Geoff was a member of the Club. Scott is married to Caroline and has three children Samantha, Charlie and Stephanie owns and operates Gippsland Funeral which has branches in Sale, Yarram and Foster. Scott also is a qualified A grade electrician, Bachelor of Business and a Master of Electronic Business and is briefing us tonight in his role as Chairman of the Committee of Wellington. Scott indicated that the committee of Wellington is a group of about twenty business people who are committed to the progressive development and promotion of the Wellington Shire and has selected five projects that they consider are of importance to the Shire and are in addition supporting the Shire in its endeavours' and being active in lobbying government to provide funding. Those projects are

- 1 Relocation of East Gippsland TAFE, Gippsland Regional Sports Centre, West Sale Airport
- 2 Macalister Irrigation District 2030 Project
- 3 All weather access for South Gippsland Highway – Longford to Sale
- 4 AusLink 2 Funding Application Princes Highway Duplication – Traralgon to Sale
- 5 RAAF Base expansion

He then outlined the committee action with respect to these projects namely the "Give us Five" campaign to relocate the Sale Netball courts to the Gippsland Regional Sports Centre and the domino effect that this event would have in freeing up the vacated site to be utilised for the new TAFE College enabling the West Sale site to be developed for the Aviation industry other consequential opportunities are the potential to consolidate sporting activities from Sale City Oval to the Gippsland Regional Sports centre thus opening up the potential to expand health services in Sale.

The committee have made direct representation to Government Ministers on the various projects and are advocating for their commitment and funding support.

Following questions President Leo thanked Scott and made the usual presentation.
