Chairman Adrian introduced David Harrington chairman of the local committee for relay for life. David indicated that he has been involved for the past 8 years when he was asked to become chairman of the local committee and that locally the relay for life has been held biannually and has raised in excess of \$450,000 for cancer research. The event is held at that Greyhound Club and involves a continuous relay of 19 hours this years event is schedule from 2pm Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> March to 9am Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> March the Rotary Club of Sale has participated in the event over that period. Clubs that raise more than \$5,000 can nominate the area of cancer research that they want the funds to be applied to. Twenty five teams have signed up to date aim is for thirty five teams. On Saturday night a Candle Light ceremony is held to commemorate lives lost to cancer (10,000 Victorians each year) and to give hope to sufferers (66 people per day are diagnosed with cancer). Entertainment is also provided. The event provides the opportunity for the community to come together for a common cause. President Leo thanked David and made the usual presentation. Adrian exhorted the members to support the event and indicate that he would circulate a roster for people to nominate a time that they would be available.
